Stopping Violence Before it Occurs


Too often, after an act of violence, those familiar with individuals involved reveal that they suspected or knew something was going to happen, but didn't know what to do with that information. In fact, in 4 out of 5 school shootings, at least one other person knew of the shooter's intent, but said nothing.¹

7 out of 10 people who complete suicide told someone of their plans or gave some kind of warning.¹ Imagine how much tragedy could be averted if these individuals said something.




Course Flow
