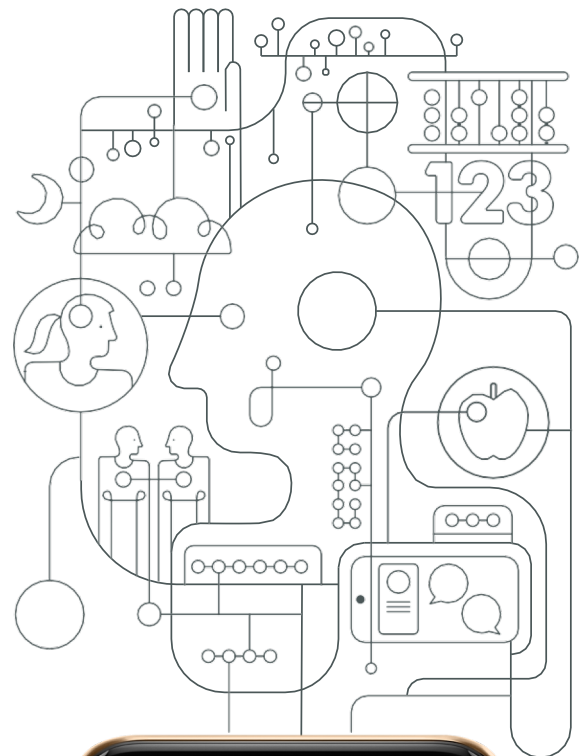

Protecting Youth Course Outline

Introduction

Learners explore their role in creating a safe environment for minors on campus.

Establishing Healthy Relationships

Learners examine the building blocks for establishing healthy relationships, including developing respectful verbal and nonverbal communication, establishing healthy boundaries, and identifying healthy and harmful interactions online and through social media (cyberstalking, cyber bullying, sexting, etc.).

Understanding Neglect and Bias

Learners understand healthy child development and identify reportable behavior including physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and neglect.

Taking Action

Learners familiarize themselves with relevant state and federal reporting requirements (including your institution's reporting policies) and develop skills for handling disclosures, making reports, and communicating effectively.

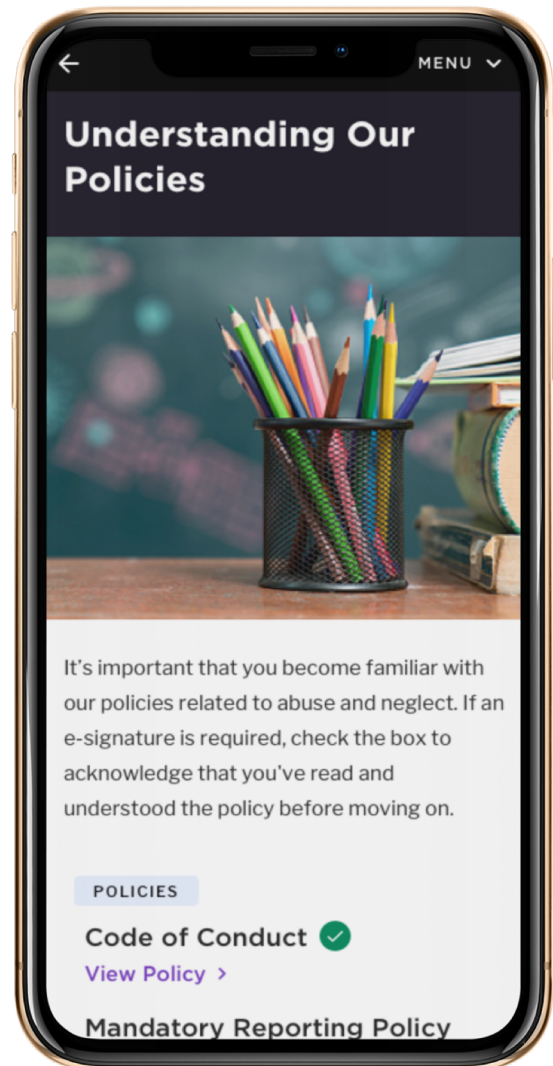
Conclusion
