



Lesson Overview:

Students investigate the need for risk management in various areas of their lives. They then explore the different types of insurance and learn how they play a role in their overall risk management strategy. They will then look at various types of insurance coverage and compare their differing benefits.

- · Define insurance terminology
- . Distinguish among the types, costs, and benefits of insurance coverage

BEFORE LESSON 7:
