
Facts and Figures

- We have 1800 schools needing accessible websites and about
- About 20% of people report as having a disability (this number is actually higher)
- In New York City, about 50% of families speak a language other than English at home
- 100% of people benefit from accessible content

Digital Accessibility and Inclusion at the DOE

Where we came from:

- The NYC DOE signed an agreement with the US DOE's Office of Civil Rights
- Schools were directed to have an accessibility statement on their websites (SY 2017/18)
- NYC DOE Launched accessible websites for families, partners, and staff in July 2018

Where we are:

- Central
 - DOE websites are accessible: Family site and InfoHub
 - Trained central staff on accessibility
 - Created a digital inclusion web page to support both central and school-based staff: schools.nyc.gov/digitalinclusion


Where we are going:

Schools need to create accessible websites:

- Part of the Principal Compliance Checklist
- Schools will receive an accessibility grade in the fall and again in the spring
- All schools must appoint a webmaster--and release them for at least one training
- Schools must show improvement in the accessibility score by June 2020

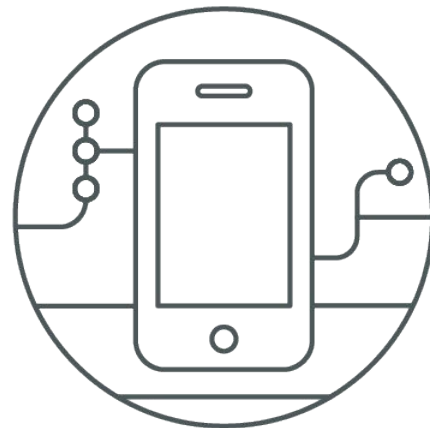

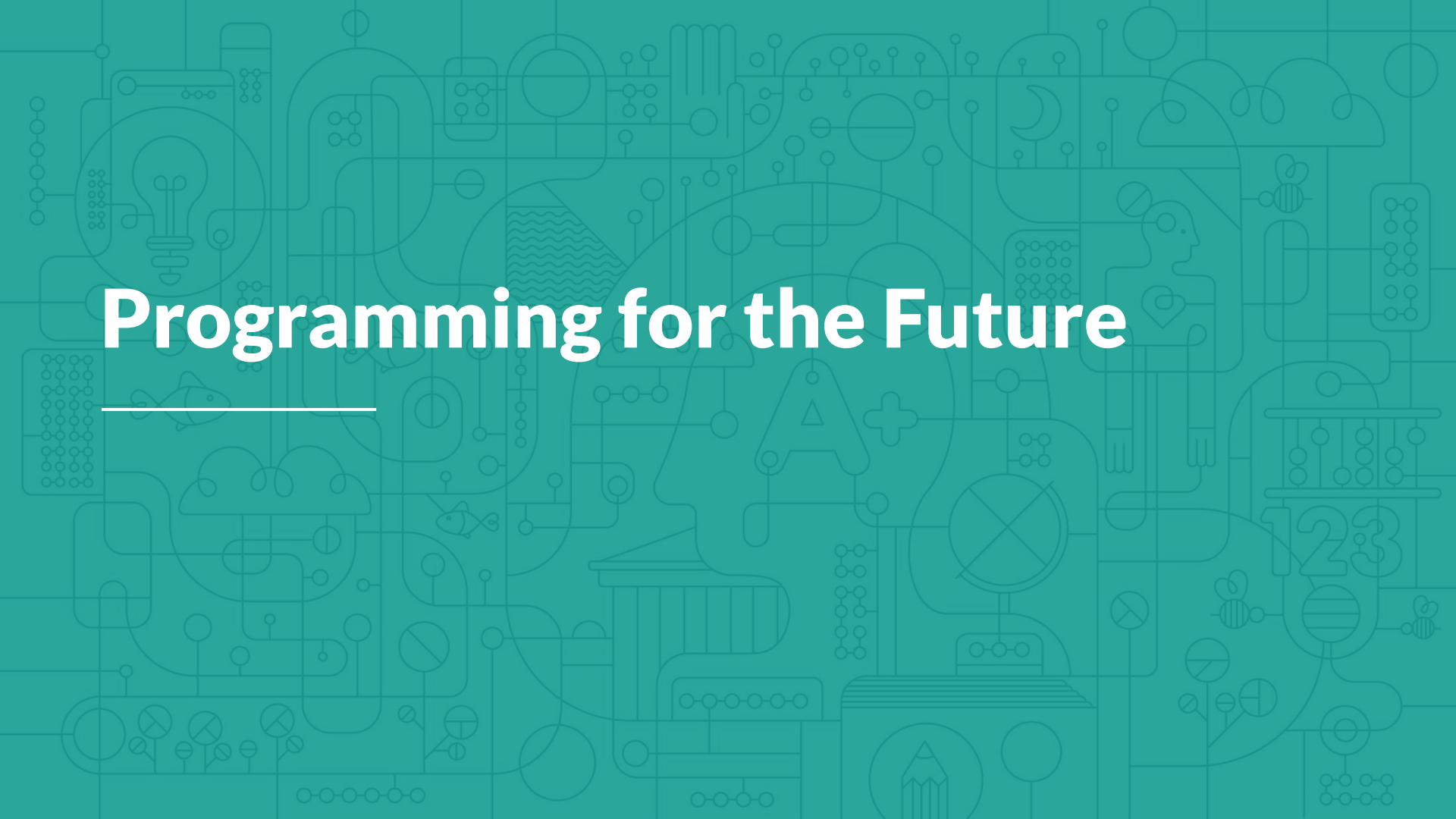

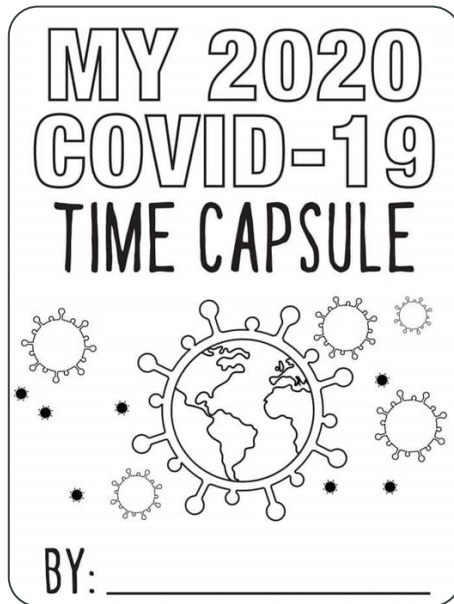

Coping Strategies

Breathe Mindfully

Mindfulness practices, like yoga and meditation, help you focus on the present, notice your feelings, thoughts, and sensations, and create a moment to pause, reflect, or just "be."

Try this as part of your morning routine, during difficult situations, or before going to sleep. Breathing at a pace that you find calming can lower your heart rate, which can help if you're having anxiety.

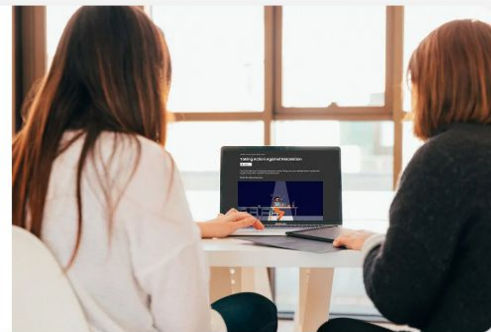
