306: African American History Timeline Project

Overview

After completing 306: African American History, students will have learned about key historical figures and events spanning from the Transatlantic Slave Trade to Mae Jemison's space flight in 1992. In this extension activity, students will get the chance to extend the timeline of Black History from the 1990s to the present.

Part 1

Students will create a timeline with 12 major moments in modern Black History that have occurred from 1992 to the present, and identify a key Black figure associated with that moment. As a guide, students can select a category within Black History such as political activism, literature, finance, science, sports or the arts. Students will write 2-3 sentences for each historical moment and figure, describing the influence and impact on the Black community.

Part 2


Students will write a paragraph comparing and contrasting the historical events and key Black figures they learned about in 306: African American History with more recent events in Black History and the individuals involved.

Learning Objectives:

- Students will identify 12 key moments in recent Black History and the contributions of specific individuals.
- Students will describe the contributions and importance of each historical moment and Black figure selected.
- Students will analyze the differences and similarities between historical and modern day figures.



Overview

The timeline in 306: African American History ends with Mae Jemison, the first African American woman who traveled to space in September 1992. We know that Black history is vast, enduring, and bountiful, stretching forward from Mae Jeminson's accomplishments into the present.

Part 1

Today you will create a timeline from 1992 to the present documenting 12 key events in recent Black history. You will also identify a key Black figure who was part of the event. Consider using a lens that is interesting to you, e.g. Black history in politics, activism, literature, finance, science, sports or the arts. Starting with Mae Jemison, write 2-3 sentences for each timeline event, describing the event and how each key figure played a role impacting American society.



Part 2

Write one paragraph comparing the historical figures and events that you learned about in 306: African American History to the modern figures and events you identified in your timeline. What were the different successes and challenges? How are these people and events similar? How are they different?
